PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

"Come follow me." It was a simple invitation that had eternal implications. With those three words Jesus was calling these fishermen into a ministry that would alter the trajectory of their own lives and the lives of the people that they would meet with the gospel. They would experience things that no one else would experience. They would be taught by Jesus himself and empowered by Jesus to perform miracles of healing and hope. But they would

also be persecuted because of Jesus, martyred for the gospel they believed and proclaimed. There was simply no way for these men to be prepared for the life to which Jesus was calling them.

Our goal at MLS is to encourage and equip high school students for lives of service, Lord willing, in the public ministry of the gospel. As the first level of our synod's ministerial education system, we are privileged to give each student a hands-on ministry experience every year of their high school education. In this way we pray that the Spirit will work in these young people both a desire to serve God's people as pastors, teachers, or staff ministers, and an ability to see themselves in that ministry context.

However, as experienced called workers, you know that no training can prepare you for every ministry context. Like those disciples called by Jesus, their ministry will be filled with undeserved rewards and epic frustrations. They will be loved and hated because of the word they preach and teach, possibly on the same day. It's hard to prepare someone for that!

And so we encourage them with the gospel every single day in chapel and a curriculum that is Christ-centered. We model a real representation of ministry that has undeserved rewards and epic frustrations. And we pray that our students see and appreciate the purpose of the ministry and have a heart to serve our Savior in that way.

Thank you for your prayers, your encouragement of your young people, and the opportunity to serve so many with the gospel in this blessed ministry.
